Bill#S735 - Rollcall #276 and Bill#S2407 - Rollcall #293 June 1 and July 7, 2016 Transgender anti-discrimination	[Baker-Polito press release, 7/8/16]: Gov. Baker today signed compromise legislation, "An Act relative to transgender anti-discrimination" (S.2407), to extend protections against discrimination for gender identity to any place of public accommodation, with the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination adopting regulations to enforce its provisions. "No one should be discriminated against in Massachusetts because of their gender identity," said Gov. Baker.
